The 36-hour course curriculum will cover SROs major responsibilities as well as Ohio School Laws, Memorandums of Understanding (MOU) for SROs, and tips on implementing an SRO in a school environment. Certificates will be distributed to students who successfully attend all sessions and complete course exercises.
